A New TB Clinic

This month a new TB clinic was opened in the CDC centre. The building was funded by Tearfund UK, Jersey and with the help of the government will help TB patients to receive rest medicine, meals and support during their sickness.

The ceremony on the 12th July was held at the new building attended by government officials, CHO staff, a Tearfund UK transforming team and regular patients to the CDC. The ceremony had tradition Khmer dancing, and boxes of noodles given out to all the patients that attend. the red ribbon was

cut by Chomno and his wife Kim as well as the Governor of Banteay Meanchey Province on behalf of the Cambodian Prime Minister, Hun Sen.

ever the local hospital facilities are in adequate for those suffering with TB. The new building allows the isolation and improved care of highly infectious patients. The building will bring much help to those in the area that are suffering from TB and we praise the Lord that it is now open and CHO can continue to try to reach the most vulnerable people in this community.

This month a team from Edinburgh, Scotland came to help where they could. A lot of the team worked amongst the children at the safe haven and the mat schools, whilst Pastor Jim spent three valuable days teaching 70 members and leaders of the churches in and around

The day went beautifully and everyone enjoyed the service as believers came together to confirm their faith. We are overjoyed with God's mercy and love to these people and we pray for more of His mighty provision as we start a school at the camp.

105 teachers from around Poipet came to attend CHO run courses on keeping a safe school. The courses included the value of the teacher-student relationship, child trafficking and the child policy in school. Both teachers and school directors attended this week long training session and we hope that schools will become safer places.
