

## Get to know each other activities and Crowd Breakers

### ***Two Truths and a Lie***

Go around the circle and have each person tell two truths about themselves and one lie. The group then tries to guess which of the three the lie is. Have fun!

### ***Believe It Or Not***

Have each group member write an amazing, unique or unusual (but unknown) fact about himself or herself on an index card. Collect the cards and then pass out a sheet of paper with each group member's name listed next to a blank space. As you read each of the cards aloud, have group members use their lists to record their guesses about whom each fact belongs to. See who can correctly match the most facts with the names.

The value of this exercise is in the conversations that will arise as people ask for explanations of the things they discover about each other.

### ***Back to Nature***

Choose one of the following questions to have each person answer and share with the group:

1. What outdoor activities do you enjoy doing?
2. If you're married, what's one thing you've learned about your spouse by spending time together in the great outdoors that you didn't know when you first were married?
3. When have you seen or experienced evidence of God in nature

### ***Questions that help to get to know each other:***

It goes without saying we're more willing to open up and be honest with people we know. One of the best ways we can get to know each other is by asking questions.

#### *"Who Are You" Questions*

1. What colors, things and type of decor do you like to surround yourself with in your home?
2. What are your hobbies and what about them do you enjoy?
3. What was the best part about your childhood?
4. What's one of your earliest memories?
5. How do you picture your life ten, twenty or thirty years from now?

#### *Fun Questions*

1. Who's your favorite cartoon character?
2. What's your favorite way to relax, both with others and by yourself?

3. What was your nickname as a kid? Why were you called that? Did you like it or hate it?
4. What are you better at than anyone else you know? What are you worse at?

*Spiritual Questions*

1. Tell me the story of how you became a Christian.
2. What would you like to change about your relationship with Christ?
3. How do you imagine or picture God?
4. What's the most meaningful Scripture passage to you and why?
5. How has your relationship with Christ changed over your life?

*Relationship Questions*

1. Growing up, who did you consider to be your best friend and why?
2. What would your friends say is the best thing about having you as their friend?
3. Do you like having a lot of friends or a few very close friends? Explain.
