

Community Camp FAQ's

How many people will attend?

Up to 150 daily but 300 different people over the 5+ days

Are there organized and supervised activities for children so I can have some adult time?

Yes, we will have scheduled times for activities for all ages.

What if I do not have an RV and tenting is out of the question? Are there hotels that are close by?

Yes, the Village Inn (229 Cottage Ave. Cashmere WA 509-782-3522) is a popular place for non-tenters and RVers to stay.

What is there to do in Cashmere for those who do not want to paintball, waterslide or water ski?

There is also antique shopping, 9 hole golf course, old downtown shops, cool diner, Aplets and Cotlets factory tour, as well as bicycle riding, visiting, napping, rock climbing at the Pinnacles (bring your own gear), golf in Leavenworth, and floating on the river. All of the above are on your own and may include a fee.

What are the eating arrangements? Do I need to bring my own dinnerware?

Your registration fee includes breakfasts and three dinners. All lunches and a couple dinners will be on your own (local restaurants, camp stoves, etc.).

Do I need to bring a chair for the meals, meetings and movie?

Only if you would like to, but there are chairs provided as well.

Do we eat provided meals at our site or in a group setting?

We will be eating the provided meals together in one of the meeting rooms.

Can I bring my dog; she always camps with me?

Sorry, but pets are not allowed by the fairgrounds administration

Can I bring my mini-bike or ATV to ride around the site?

Please only bicycles for riding around camp.

CAMPERS/TENTERS

What is the camping situation like?

Grassy fields.

Are there trees for shade or should I bring a shelter?

There are a few trees but not many, so a sun shelter would be a good consideration.

What is the weather like? Sun? Wind?

Sunny and warm, sometimes windy.

Are there showers for tenters? I assume there are bathrooms.

Yes there are showers and bathrooms for tenters.

Are there picnic tables at the camp sites?

Yes, but also a good idea to bring a fold up table.

Are fire pits available?

We provide a propane fire pit for all to use.

Can I bring a portable fire pit?

Yes, if it's propane.

Do I need to bring a camp stove? and/or Lantern?

It stays light until after 9pm, so a lantern is your call. As for a stove, continental breakfast is provided Mon & Fri mornings. Hot breakfast Tues, Weds, & Thurs. Dinner is provided M, W & F. There are a few restaurants available in Cashmere.

Is drinking water available? Should I bring a water container?

Water is available but you will need a container to haul it to your camp site.

Where do I park my car in relationship to my tent?

Designated parking nearby.

What is the bug situation like?

Few bugs.

Is there a place to wash my dishes?

Yes.

Where do I get ice for my ice chest?

The kitchen can provide some ice, but ice can be purchased in Cashmere as well.

FOR THOSE WITH RVS

What is the hook-up arrangement?

Spaces are located in a big open field with hook-ups every 25 feet. There are no trees or concrete pads.

Is there sewer hook-up? Water? Electrical? Cable?

There are hook-ups for sewer, water, electrical. There is no cable available.

Is there WiFi?

Yes.

Are there bathrooms and showers for those in pop-ups without such?

Yes.

Are fire pits available for RVer's?

Yes, but due to fire danger their use is governed by fairgrounds administration

Can I bring an additional car with my RV?

Yes.
